The Presbyterian & Reformed Commission on Chaplains and Military Personnel (PRCC) is pleased to offer a scholarship to men sensing a Call to military chaplaincy, and who could use some financial assistance with their seminary costs. The scholarship is named in honor of Stan Beach, long time PRCC Associate Director and retired Navy Chaplain.

These scholarship awards will take place one time per calendar year. The deadline for applications will be September 30 of each year. The application is available on the PRCC website: www.PRCC.co.

The PRCC determines all scholarship recipients through the use of a scholarship committee, assigned by the PRCC, and chaired by the PRCC Endorser and Executive Director.

The PRCC determines the scholarship award recipients according to its own policies and that it expressly rejects any effort to honor a donor's recommendation(s).

Scholarships are awarded without regard to sex, race, nationality, or national origin.

Recipients of scholarships and the amount they are to receive will be based on funds already received.

The criteria for scholarship qualification are:

1. The applicant must be enrolled in an accredited seminary.
2. Applications will only be considered from men who affirm that they plan to pursue a career as a PRCC denomination Teaching Elder and a military chaplain in some capacity.
3. Applicants must be US Citizens, or Permanent Residents must include a letter stating their intent to become a U.S. citizen. The application must be accompanied by a copy of the applicant's Permanent Registration Card.
4. The applicant must be a member in good standing of a PRCC denomination congregation.
5. Applications must be submitted complete and on time (on or before September 30th of each consideration calendar year).
6. All applicants will receive word by November 30 of each year as to whether or not their application was approved, and if so, for how much.
7. Award checks will be mailed out in December of each year.
8. These scholarships meet the IRS guidelines required in order that these scholarship awards are non-taxable to the recipients.
