Firm Foundation interns will be serving as a teacher's assistant in a class of elementary students throughout the summer tutoring program. This will include organizing volunteers that will assist in your class rooms throughout the summer and maintaining a safe and fun learning atmosphere!

## THE BAIL PROJECT

The Bail Project, Inc. is a non-profit organization designed to combat mass incarceration by disrupting the money bail system - one person at a time. There's a profound injustice at the heart of the American legal system. Those who can afford to pay bail go home to await trial, while those who can't languish in jail, There they lose their homes, jobs, all the wealth they've worked so hard to build, and in some cases custody of their children. The Bail Project pays bail for people in need, thus reuniting families and restoring the presumption of innocence.



Interns working with The Bail Project will get to be a part of the inner workings of the organization in an office setting. They will aid in connecting people with health and social service groups and help to provide phone call reminders, bus passes, and child care assistance to make sure people can make it to all of their court dates.
